I would like to take this opportunity to give you an update on the wonderful blessings that took place this year at Caring Pregnancy Options.

As a result of your faithful support, CPO was able to meet the needs of many women in the Topeka area, physical as well as spiritual. In 2009 we shared the gospel and gave each client a one page Bible study to complete, with 135 Bibles given out. This resulted in many women making life changing decisions to follow Christ. We helped 1,218 clients

with physical items, such as: maternity clothes, diapers, formula, baby clothes, cribs, and more. We also did a total of 469 pregnancy tests. With the help of ultrasound the abortion minded clients were able to see their baby and most had a change of heart and chose to give their baby life!

The total financial support we received in 2009 for CPO and ARC amounted to \$79,330.70 and our total expenses were \$78,782.96.

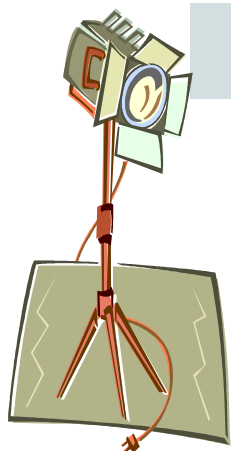
As many of you may already
